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Apps To Teach About Passover:

After 400 years of slavery, the Israelites are finally beginning their journey out of Egypt. Help them pack the most useful items in this active game that encourages problem solving, discovery, and Jewish values.

Follow a simple scavenger hunt and take pictures of everyday items using the camera on your phone or tablet. Listen closely as Ethan & Daria give you clues that will have you searching for that perfect item to photograph.

After, review your photos with a grown-up to make sure that you've packed the right things and are ready to cross the Red Sea into freedom! Have fun!

Grown-ups: Exodus! provides many chances for you and your children to play together. When your child shows you his or her photos or hands you the mobile device, you can use that moment as a chance to talk about what they took pictures of, and why. You may be surprised by some of the creative answers!
